

When to Screen for COVID-19

Preprocedure inpatient/outpatient

1. Signs or symptoms of COVID-19?

Yes

Screen for COVID-19

No

2. History of COVID-19 in the last 180 days?

No, next question

Yes, don't screen

3. Are you vaccinated for COVID-19?

No, next question

Yes, don't screen

4. Has the individual been around a known positive in the last 14 days?

No, don't screen

Yes, screen

Definitions

Symptoms of COVID-19 include: Fever/chills, cough, shortness of breath, fatigue, muscle/body aches, headache, new loss of taste/smell, sore throat, congestion/runny nose, nausea/vomiting, diarrhea

History of COVID-19 includes: Being diagnosed with COVID-19 in the last 180 days, person has natural immunity and does not need to be tested unless has sign/symptoms again.

Vaccinated includes: Having received the 1st dose of Pfizer/Moderna at least 10 days ago, and it has not been longer than 180* days since full vaccination status. **May be extended beyond 6 months once additional data is available.*

Known positive in last 14 days, if patient has no signs or symptoms, has not had COVID-19 in the last 180 days, has not been vaccinated, but has been around a known positive case in the last 14 days - Screen the patient for COVID-19.
