Oklahoma COVID-19 Risk Level



Cleveland County's current risk level (as well as most of the state's counties) is: **Moderate**

The Oklahoma State Department of Health has developed the Oklahoma COVID-19 Risk Level System; a four-tiered risk measurement tool with corresponding color categories that identify the current COVID-19 risk level. This tool offers the public and local elected officials an easy way to recognize each county's risk level. IMMYLabs Sunday Vaccine Clinics

The Norman City Council approved a COVID-19 vaccine incentives program to use \$500,000 in American Rescue Plan Act (APRA) money for vaccination pods, mobile vaccination units, and gift cards incentives for vaccinations. The vaccination pop-up POD through IMMYLabs will be from 2 p.m. - 4 p.m. on Sundays at various locations in Norman.

Incentives will include \$25 restaurant gift cards to local restaurants for individuals that receive the first, second, or booster vaccination. Each individual will also be entered into two door prize drawings. Drawing one will be for a \$500 VISA gift card, and the second drawing will be for Apple Air Pods. Gift cards and other door prizes will be available on-site to those who set an appointment and attend a vaccination POD.

Vaccine Program Survey Deadline Approaching

The deadline for the Norman Regional vaccine program survey is this Sunday, October 31. Healers who fail to meet this deadline will be notified by administration and are expected to complete the COVID vaccination survey without delay. Those who do not respond to the survey will face progressive disciplinary action up to suspension.

Boo to the Flu

Norman Regional flu vaccine clinics have ended, but from 9 a.m. to noon Saturday, October 30 at the Norman Regional Moore Conference Center, the Boo to the Flu vaccine clinic, presented by the Norman Regional Foundation, will be offering free flu vaccines to adults and children ages six months to 65 years.

Only those receiving the vaccine and one support person (if needed for assistance) are allowed inside. Masks are required and if you do not feel well, have a fever or signs of respiratory illness, please do not attend this event.
